

# America's Chemical Warfare – Poison Gas involvement

**From: Medical Experiments, “A History of Secret Human Experimentations”**

**1994 - Senator John D. Rockefeller issues a report revealing that for at least 50 years the Department of Defense has used hundreds of thousands of military personnel in human experiments and for intentional exposure to dangerous substances. Materials included mustard and nerve gas, ionizing radiation, psychochemicals, hallucinogens, and drugs used during the Gulf War .**

## Chemical Warfare, i.e., Poison Gas:

WWI – chlorine, phosgene, mustard and, to a lesser extent, bromine and chloropicrin. Initiated by the French, followed up by the Germans and British, with the United States beginning large scale production of an “improved vesicant” gas known as Lewisite, near the end of the war. By the time of the armistice on 11 November, a plant in Ohio was producing 10 tons per day. <http://www.firstworldwar.com/weaponry/gas.htm>.

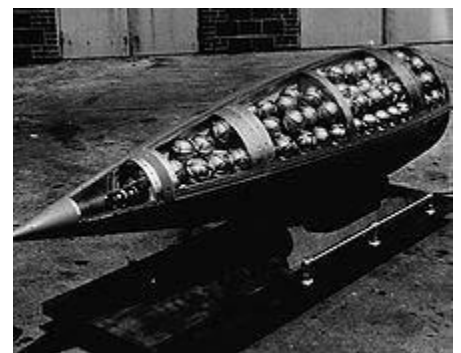
Poison gas was internationally “outlawed” in 1925, yet the U.S. still used a nerve gas known as sarin in Vietnam.

“The Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC) is an arms control agreement which outlaws the production, stockpiling and use of chemical weapons. Its full name is the Convention on the Prohibition of the Development, Production, Stockpiling and Use of Chemical Weapons and on their Destruction.”

Since “the CWC was ratified by the Senate, Albania, Libya, Russia, the United States, and India have declared over 71,000 metric tons of chemical weapon stockpiles, and destroyed about a third of them. Under the terms

of the agreement, the United States and Russia are supposed to eliminate the rest of their supplies of chemical weapons by 2012. But that looks unlikely– the U.S. government estimates remaining stocks will be destroyed by 2017.”

“Despite numerous efforts to reduce or eliminate them, some nations continue to research and/or stockpile chemical warfare agents A summary of the nations that have either declared weapon stockpiles or are suspected of secretly stockpiling or possessing CW research programs include United States and Russia.”

Operators completed operations in April 2010, marking the destruction of the largest recovered chemical warfare inventory in the nation.”
